The RATP and the SNCF have a network of 15 metro lines, 1 funicular, 5 RER suburban train lines, 6 tramway lines, 349 bus lines and many train lines.

Paris Visite

One ticket for travel on all Parisian and Île-de-France public transport for 1, 2, 3 or 5 consecutive days.

Zones 1 to 3: Paris and the inner suburbs (La Défense, Le Bourget for the Air and Space Museum, the Stade de France...).

Air France coaches

Air France coaches provide a direct link between central Paris and Charles de Gaulle and Orly airports.

There are five stops within the city: Étoile/Champs-Élysées, Porte Maillot, Invalides, Gare de Lyon and Gare Montparnasse. The service operates 7 days a week from 5am to 11.40pm with departures every 20 to 30 minutes depending on the line.

Destination Impressionism

From the precursors of Impressionism to those who were inspired by it, many sites in Paris and its region have been marked by great painters such as Monet, Renoir, Sisley, Degas...

High point for 2015: the international celebration of the 125th anniversary of Vincent Van Gogh's death means it's the ideal time to visit Auvers-sur-Oise.

125th anniversary of the death of Van Gogh

Auvers-sur-Oise: the last days in the life of Van Gogh

Less than thirty kilometres from Paris, Auvers-sur-Oise owes its reputation to Vincent van Gogh who moved there in 1890. In less than 70 days he created nearly 80 paintings amongst which were *Champ de blé aux corbeaux* (Wheatfield with Crows), *Portrait du Dr Gachet* (Portrait of Dr Gachet) and *L'Église d'Auvers-sur-Oise* (The Church at Auvers-sur-Oise). Vincent Van Gogh died on 29th July. He is buried in the Auvers-sur-Oise cemetery next to his brother Theo.



Auvers-sur-Oise: an open-air museum

Auvers attracts visitors from all over the world on a pilgrimage to visit Van Gogh country. They discover an open-air museum of landscapes that have been preserved along with their many historical monuments such as Notre-Dame Church, the Auberge Ravoux, the house of Dr Gachet as well as the Château d'Auvers, the Musée de l'Absinthe and Daubigny's home-studio.



Château d'Auvers

The show *Voyage au temps des Impressionnistes* (A journey through the Impressionist era) plunges visitors into the atmosphere of Haussmannian Paris and its cabarets. It offers an introduction to absinthe, the fashions of the late 1880s, train travel and the famous Saint-Lazare station, journeys to the coast, painters and their floating studios...

Film projections, scenery, videos, music... Everything brings this era back to life, an era so rich in the lights and colours of Monet, Renoir and Pissarro.



The Musée d'Orsay has 24 paintings by Vincent van Gogh that retrace his artistic development between Paris and Arles. They are a testimony to the painter's genius that led him beyond Impressionism, to open a new and singular artistic path.

The Parisian period is illustrated by works such as *Autoportrait de 1887* (Self-portrait of 1887), *L'Italienne* (The Italian Woman), *Le Restaurant de la Sirène à Asnières* (Restaurant de la Sirène at Asnières) or *Les Fritillaires* (Fritillaries).

In these paintings are the colours and lights that Van Gogh borrowed from the Impressionists.

The works created in the south of France are celebrated in particular by *La Chambre de Van Gogh à Arles* (Van Gogh's Room in Arles), *La Méridienne*, *La Nuit étoilé* (Starry Night) or the *Autoportrait de 1889* (Self-portrait of 1889).

From Van Gogh's last few days spent in Auvers-sur-Oise, the museum exhibits major paintings such as *Le Portrait du Dr Gachet* and *L'Église d'Auvers-sur-Oise*.



Dedicated to the history of *Butte Montmartre*, this museum tells the tale of the area's artistic effervescence and the atmosphere of its famous cabarets through paintings, posters and drawings by Toulouse-Lautrec, Modigliani, Kupka, Steinlen, Valadon, Utrillo...

In October 2014, the Montmartre museum offers new areas and a restaurant serving light meals with a view over the gardens.

Studio-flat *Chez Valadon and Utrillo*

Suzanne Valadon, famous for being one of the first women painters, moved in to number 12 rue Cortot in 1898. She stayed there again between 1912 and 1926 with her boyfriend André Utter and his son Maurice Utrillo who painted unforgettable views of Montmartre. The workshop has been reconstructed and opens its doors to the public for the first time.

Hotel Demarne

Completely refurbished, this beautiful 19th century private residence can now host top level temporary exhibitions. Père Tanguy, who sold colours to Impressionist painters, had lodgings there.

Café Renoir

On the ground floor of Hotel Demarne, in the summer months Café Renoir extends its patio into the Renoir Gardens. This tea room offers delicious afternoon teas and light snacks under the conservatory that was designed by Hubert Le Gall. The conservatory is heated in winter.

Imperial residence at Fontainebleau

Surrounded by 130 hectares of parks and gardens, the Château de Fontainebleau is listed as a UNESCO world heritage site. Napoleon I considered it to be "the real home of kings, a house of centuries".

■ Château de Fontainebleau

Ceaselessly renovated and refurbished, Fontainebleau experienced eight centuries of continuous royal presence, from the arrival of Louis VII the Younger in 1137, to the abdication of Napoleon III in 1870.

Today, it still houses a great many treasures of the Imperial era.

Napoleon I hastened to restore and refurnish the chateau that the French revolution had emptied.

The Napoleon I Museum has an exceptional collection of furniture, art, *objets d'art*, weapons, clothing, documents and historical souvenirs that belonged to the Imperial family.

The Sovereign *Grands Appartements* present the private apartment of Napoleon I, as it would have been in the First Empire. The *Petits Appartements* can also be visited. They were inhabited by Napoleon and Joséphine, then Napoleon and Marie-Louise.

Le Grand Trianon

The Grand Trianon, built by Jules Hardouin Mansart in 1687, is without a doubt the most refined collection of buildings in the entire Versailles estate.

After having commissioned its restoration, Napoleon Bonaparte stayed there several times with his second wife, the Empress Marie-Louise.

The current layout is very close to that of the First Empire.

The Emperor's small apartments

Napoleon occupied these apartments for the first time in 1809, in the period that followed his divorce from Joséphine.

Museum of French History

The Coronation Hall displays décor celebrating the glory of the Empire heightened by two paintings by Jacques-Louis David, *Le sacre de Napoléon* (The Coronation of Napoleon) and *Le serment fait à l'Empereur par l'armée après la distribution des aigles* (The Distribution of the Eagle Standards). There are also portraits of Napoleon and his two wives, Joséphine de Beauharnais and Marie-Louise de Habsbourg-Lorraine.

In the 1792 Hall, visitors can admire portraits of Bonaparte and young officers who were to become his generals and marshals. Further on, a monumental painting depicts the battle of Wagram, in 1809 (*Galerie des Batailles*).

After defeat at Waterloo, Napoleon abdicated. Queen Hortense, his step-daughter, welcomed him at Malmaison.

Aged 46, he was planning to build a life for himself in America. He went to Rochefort-sur-Mer, but the two frigates ready to take him and his suite to America never left harbour as they were blocked by English ships.

Having retreated to the Isle of Aix, Napoleon negotiated his surrender; the British insisted on his exile.

Organised for the bicentenary of the fall of the First Empire (Waterloo 1815) and the exile of Napoleon to Saint Helena, this exhibition evokes the transitory period of the Napoleonic era.

Napoleon: a man of war

Paris is full of sights and monuments marked by Napoleon. At the Hôtel national des Invalides, Napoleon the soldier is celebrated. It is a great starting point for visiting other sites that illustrate the campaigns of this great military leader.

Hôtel national des Invalides

Army Museum

Part of the prestigious Hôtel National des Invalides, the Army Museum boasts priceless collections, from the Middle Ages to the modern day.

The collections concerning Napoleon Bonaparte, his armies and his marshals are particularly remarkable. The museum retraces the Imperial campaigns and presents the weaponry and military corps that made their mark.

Among the treasures presented by the museum, the famous painting by Jean-Auguste-Dominique Ingres: *Napoléon 1^{er} sur le trône* (Napoleon I on his Imperial Throne). Also present are the chain of the Grand Master of the Order of the Legion of Honour and a case of four pistols that belonged to Napoleon.

Tomb of Napoleon I

The Dome Church houses Napoleon's monumental tomb, the tomb of his son and the tombs of famous military leaders (Turenne, Vauban, Foch, etc.). Made entirely of red quartz on a base of green granite from Les Vosges, the tomb is surrounded by a laurel crown and 12 "Victories" sculpted by Pradier, symbolising Napoleon's military campaigns. At the back of the crypt there is a statue of the Emperor wearing the Imperial symbol.

Panthéon

Originally, under Louis XV, the Panthéon was dedicated to Saint Genevieve, the patron saint of Paris. Since then, with the admission of Victor Hugo in 1885, it has become the place of rest for French patriots: Voltaire, Rousseau, Zola, Pierre and Marie Curie...

The First Empire is the period during which the greatest number were admitted to the Panthéon: 41 grand dignitaries of the Empire were buried here.

Firmly established in Place du Trocadéro, this museum of the Navy presents a unique collection of 1,000 extraordinary objects. Once inside the door, the rich and ornate décor on *Canot de l'Empereur* (the Emperor's Rowing Boat) is staggering.

Other testimonies to the Imperial era include the Sword of the "Marins de Garde", the corps that accompanied the French Army from 1805 and the model ships (*Muiron*, a frigate with 44 canons built in 1797 and *Le Triomphant*, a ship with 74 canons).

Arc de triomphe

In 1806, immediately following the Battle of Austerlitz, Napoleon ordered the construction of the Arc de triomphe in honour of France's great army. The monument was to dominate Paris and satisfy the Emperor's taste for Antiquity. 50 metres high and 45 metres wide, the Arc de Triomphe is a sumptuous masterpiece standing proudly at the top of the Champs-Élysées. From its balcony, experience a unique panorama of Paris, night and day.



Paris under Napoléon

Napoleon was also responsible for the construction of the Canal de l'Ourcq and the Canal Saint-Martin, built to ease traffic on the River Seine. In the same spirit bridges were built (Austerlitz, Pont des Arts, Iéna...) and fountains installed for the comfort of the local residents (in particular the fountain in Place du Châtelet).

A number of monuments are dedicated to the glory of his French army: the Église de la Madeleine, Colonne Vendôme and also the Arc de triomphe.


The Battlefields of the Marne

Around Meaux, the last front line protecting Paris, there are still visible traces of the Great War (monuments, cemeteries, landscapes).

Departing from Meaux, the guided coach tour will introduce where the Battle of the Marne took place.

For two hours, the tour follows the progress of the French troops, and includes many commemorative sites: Charles Péguy Memorial and the Grand Tombe Memorial, St Barthélémy Church, Notre Dame de Bercy, the American War Memorial...

1 DAY

Musée de la Grande Guerre de Meaux and Bois Belleau Battlefield

This tour begins with a visit to the American cemetery of Aisne and Marne to pay tribute to the American soldiers who fell whilst fighting in this area.

The tour continues in Bois Belleau forest, the most murderous of battlefields for the Marines in June 1918. Traces of the trenches and shell holes can still be seen, results of the violent fighting.

The following stage takes visitors to the 304 Monument high above Château-Thierry.

After lunch, the tour heads to Meaux to the Museum of the Great War and its collection of over 50,000 objects.

3 DAYS

The First World War - History and Memory

In 3 days (2 nights), this very full tour includes several battlefields of the Marne and the north of France, covering a total of 580km.

DAY 1

Departing from Paris, the trip begins with a guided tour of the Museum of the Great War, Pays de Meaux, then joins the "Chemin des Dames", where fierce battles were fought in 1914 and 1917.

DAY 2

This day is dedicated to the Battle of Verdun with the discovery of the town and its military fortifications. A guided tour takes visitors to the right bank battlefield, then to Fort "Douaumont" and its ossuary with the remains of 130,000 unidentified soldiers, and finally the "Tranchée des baïonnettes", to understand the horror of the fighting.

DAY 3

The tour crosses the battlefield to the left bank, where fighting was fierce. In Romagna under Montfaucon, the largest American cemetery in Europe commemorates the courage of 14,246 soldiers.

The tour ends at the Arc de triomphe and the tomb of the unknown soldier.

Major sites of the First World War

A number of key points in the First World War took place in Paris and its region: the assassination of Jean Jaurès in the Café du Croissant, Rue Montmartre; the departure of French soldiers from the Gare de l'Est; the Battle of l'Ourcq; the taxis of the Marne leaving Invalides to support the troops on the front lines; the Eiffel Tower intercepting enemy messages; the peace treaty signed in the hall of Mirrors in the Château de Versailles...



Suresnes American Cemetery

On the slopes of Mont-Valérien, this 3-hectare site is typical of American military cemeteries: huge green lawns topped with rows of white marble crosses. Here there are 1,541 tombs of American soldiers who died in the First World War. On the walls of the chapel, bronze plaques commemorate the memory of 974 men who disappeared at sea.

Arc de triomphe

Army Museum - Hôtel national des Invalides

The richness of the collections makes it one of the most important museums for military art and history in the world.

There are many objects from the First World War on display here, like one of the famous Marne taxis, named after the battle fought in September 1914.

Further on, a model of the first line of trenches evokes the horror of the front lines. A 75mm-cannon (1897 model), the main weapon in the French arsenal, and the bugle that sounded the armistice of 11th November 1918 can also be seen.

In 1914, Gare de l'Est station saw many soldiers leave for the front lines. On display since 1926 in the station's main hall, the fresco entitled *Le départ des poilus, août 1914* (The infantry depart, August 1914), bears witness to the station's importance in the war.

This monumental painting (60m²) tells the tale of their departure for the trenches. The fresco is a tribute by American painter Albert Herter to his son, a volunteer in the French army who was killed in the last few months of the war, in 1918.

Musée de la Grande Guerre du Pays de Meaux

(Museum of the Great war, Pays de Meaux)

An essential destination to understand the First World War and its effects on society, this museum presents a collection unique in Europe. Located on the actual front lines of the Marne, it is an ideal departure point for visiting the battlefields to the north and east of France.

With a unique collection in Europe, the Museum of the Great War in Pays de Meaux offers a new vision of the world's first war. Under the large nave, the reconstruction of a battlefield brings together tanks and planes.

Its permanent exhibition covers 3,000m² and includes all aspects of the conflict through appealing and innovative layout and design: projections, soundtracks and interactive terminals. In particular, it shows how between 1914 and 1918 the world moved from the 19th to the 20th century.

A tour lasting just over an hour offers an immersive experience. It begins in the 1870s, when the first tensions led to the start of the First World War and finishes in 1939 at the dawn of the Second World War.
